

## Context

The 2019 EU Open Data & Re-Use of Public Sector Information Directive was transposed into Irish law by the Open Data & Re-use of Public Sector Information Regulations 2021. The NTMA is a public sector body for the purpose of these Regulations.

Open Data is defined as data that gives access to non-personal government data which can deliver enhanced economic, social, environmental and democratic benefits to all.

The NTMA publishes information on its website and under the Freedom of Information Act Publication Scheme. Details in relation to re-use of this data are included on the NTMA Open Data and Re-Use of Public Sector Information webpage.



The NTMA Open Data Liaison Officer has conducted an initial audit of relevant datasets. Further planned actions are set out below.

## Planned Actions 2024 - 2026

- Identify relevant data sets for listing on the Public Service Data Catalogue (PSDC)
- Identify relevant datasets for publication on the Open Data Portal (data.gov.ie) in an applicable format (i.e. PDF/CSV file etc.)
- Review and update data audit to determine any additional datasets that may be applicable for inclusion on the PSDC and/or publication on Open Data Portal
- Regularly monitor and maintain published datasets
